Everyday Stewardship

My wife and I have used the same baptismal gown for all 3 of our children. It is a very long traditional gown made with fabric taken from my wife's first communion dress and my mother-inlaw's wedding gown. It is a symbol not just of each child being washed clean by the sacrament, but also of family and how faith has been passed down through generations. Faith is a gift and that gown shows how this family has taken seriously the cultivation of that faith and the sharing of it with those we love the most.

By our baptism we are called to a discipleship that compels us to share our faith with others. It is not always easy, but it would be wrong to horde that faith and not let it shine for others to see. When we think about a stewardship way of life, we sometimes focus on material goods, our talents and skills, or our time. But faith is a gift that needs to be treated in a similar way. We are heirs with Jesus Christ to this rich tapestry of faith and the Church. If all of us were to hide that faith and not seek to share it with others, that lineage would end with us.

We live during a time in history where in some lands people are finding Jesus in huge numbers, while in other places the numbers of people in the pews is declining sharply. We can spend all our time talking about these realities or we can choose to respond to our baptismal call. Jesus commanded us to go forth and make disciples of all nations. Maybe we can begin with our neighbor.

The Church asks us to think about the mystery of the God we believe in—one God, three Divine persons.

God reveals Himself to us as *Father/Creator*, *Son/Redeemer* and *Holy Spirit/sanctifier*. He does this so that we can develop a personal relationship with each of those Divine Persons.



Next Sunday, June 2nd We will celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi

Each time we receive Holy Communion, we unite ourselves with the Lord Jesus. He died for us and now lives within us. In gratitude we will have a procession in the Church, with the Blessed Sacrament, following the 12:30 pm Mass. Following the procession, the Blessed Sacrament will remain on the altar until Benediction and Reposition at 4:30 pm. All parishioners are encouraged to join us in professing our faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.



Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament

Following Sunday's 12:30 pm Mass (unless otherwise noted in the bulletin)

Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament is not only a very old devotion in our Church, but one that highlights the fundamental mystery of the Holy Eucharist that our Lord is truly present, body and blood, soul and divinity, in the Blessed Sacrament.

Exposition follows the 12:30 pm Sunday Mass ending with Benediction and Reposition at 4:30.





The Eucharistic Prayer (Part I)

The Eucharistic Prayer is the heart of the Liturgy of the Eucharist and one of the foundational elements of Holy Mass. It is found in the most ancient descriptions of the Eucharistic celebration. Faithful to the Lord's mandate and using His words, the bishop or priest celebrant acts in the person of Christ as head of His body (in persona Christi capitis), the Church. Through the grace of the Holy Spirit, the sacrifice at the altar is joined to that of the Son who offers Himself to His heavenly Father on our behalf.

While St. Justin recounts the Eucharistic Prayer was first prayed by the priest "according to his abilities" (that is, made up or loosely passed from bishops to bishops and priests), versions quickly became formalized and written down. By the mid 500s, the Roman Canon was the most widespread Eucharistic Prayer used in the Roman Rite of the Western Church, and by 1570 it was virtually the only text used.

From the very beginning, the faithful gathered have always given their assent or agreement to the prayer with an "Amen."

Saint Patrick's 175th Anniversary!

St. Patrick's is proud to be a pillar of the Catholic faith in Bay Ridge for 175 years and we want to celebrate this amazing achievement with our parishioners and community.

Our 175th Anniversary Year provides us time to reflect on our spiritual journey, acknowledge the contributions of our parish family and rejoice in the unity and growth we have experienced over the years.

1936-1962

Father Joseph Kelly became pastor on January 11, 1936. St. Patrick's was no longer a small rural church but was a flourishing urban parish. One of his first projects was the conversion of the church basement into a suitable place for the offering of Mass. In addition a central heating plant was installed to supply all the parish buildings.

In December 1938 Edmond Huott donated the automatic church bell in honor of his parents. The bell was installed and blessed by Monsignor Hoar, Vicar General of the Diocese of

Brooklyn, December 18, 1938. Monsignor James Griffiths, Assistant Chancellor of Brooklyn delivered the address in honor of the occasion.

In order to meet the ever-expanding needs of the parish St. Patrick's took title to a large tract of land along 97th Street on June 1, 1938 and was used as a playground for many years. At that time, the small building that had housed District School No. 4 was moved to a location behind the rectory.

In 1939, a new chapel was opened for the Sisters in their convent which had previously been improved by the addition of six new rooms, an infirmary and a common room. These renovations were necessary due to the increase in the number of Sisters serving the enlarged parish school.

THE SAINT PATRICK BELL

In the late 1950's St. Patrick's 95th Street school building was enlarged. A new school was built on Fourth Avenue and 97th Street in 1958. There was a large auditorium on the first floor and a gymnasium on the lower level. The student body was quite large and fully occupied both schools.
