We Can Prepare the Upper Room

We all know that person, don't we? Hey, maybe we've even been that person.

"I have a great relationship with God, but I don't go to church regularly. God and I are on good terms. I can talk to Him just fine on my own."

There isn't anything false in these statements. It's important to have an intimate, even conversational prayer relationship with God. But the problem with this attitude is that it implies that churches don't matter. Community worship doesn't matter. Today, we are reminded exactly why that is so untrue. Why we need our parishes, our priests, and each other.

The Body and Blood of Christ — that's what it's all about. If it's not about that, it's not about anything. If we don't have the Eucharist, we're just like the ancient priests, making sacrifices that don't have the power to redeem anybody.

Where do we receive the Body and Blood of Christ? For most of us, it's in our parishes. The altar of sacrifice is also the table we gather in front of, as a family, to become one with Christ in the truest and realest way possible, recreating the scene in the Upper Room over and over again every time Mass is celebrated.

The disciples were commissioned by Christ to prepare the Upper Room for the Last Supper. How can we take up that work ourselves? How can we strengthen the bonds in our spiritual family? How can we serve our parish, always remembering that the table is not meant to be set only for two?

Feast of Corpus Christi

The Feast of Corpus Christi, also known as the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, is

a liturgical solemnity celebrating the Real Presence of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ in the elements of the Eucharist. At the heart of this solemnity is the celebration of Christ's constant presence here on earth, fully alive in the Eucharist.

Following today's 12:30 pm Mass there will be a procession, with the Blessed Sacrament, in the Church. The Blessed Sacrament will remain on the altar until Benediction and Reposition at 4:30 pm.

The Eucharistic Prayer (Part Two)


While the Roman Canon, or Eucharistic Prayer I, was the only Eucharistic Prayer prior to the Council and still has pride of place, the liturgical renewal that followed Vatican II included the reintroduction or creation of other Eucharistic Prayers.

Eucharistic Prayer II is based on the early Eucharistic Prayer of St. Hippolytus. Eucharistic Prayer III is inspired by Gallican (French) and Mozarabic (Spanish) prayers. And Eucharistic Prayer IV is based on the anaphora of St. Basil. These four prayers are the most widely used today, but others have been created to help focus the thanksgiving prayer at special celebrations.

While not as familiar as the four mentioned above, there are nine additional Eucharistic Prayers: Reconciliation I and II, which have a penitential character; four for Various Needs and Occasions, with themes of "The Church on the Path of Unity" (I), "God Guides His Church along the Way of Salvation" (II), "Jesus, the Way to the Father" (III), and "Jesus, Who Went About Doing Good" (IV); and finally, three for Masses with Children.

All these Eucharistic Prayers have either a proper or suggested preface, except for the Roman Canon and Eucharistic Prayer III.


