Everyday Stewardship

I have coached all three of my children in soccer at some time in their lives. I loved teaching them and their teammates the importance of functioning as one unit. If we were not all moving together toward victory, we would all find ourselves together in defeat. We used to go through one drill I called the "human foosball." We would scrimmage with players in lines like on a foosball table. If you ever got too far behind or too far ahead of those in your line, play would stop and the ball would go to the other team. The goal was to help build an awareness of where your teammates were on the pitch and to teach the lesson that no one player is a team onto themselves.

As disciples and stewards, we sometimes find ourselves far behind or maybe even too far ahead. As a consequence, our actions either hinder the ability of the Body of Christ to evangelize and pass on the faith to a new generation or present the Church as an entity that sees itself as judgmental or too holy to be in the world. We are called to community, and in that community, we must be aware of our brothers and sisters in the faith. At times, we need to help them grow in their faith. Other times, we need to slow down and realize that we cannot change the world on our own. We all have unique gifts we are called to share, and we can only bear true witness to the power of the Body of Christ when we are all moving together and making each other strong.

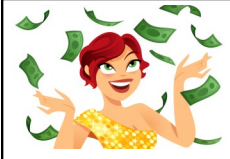

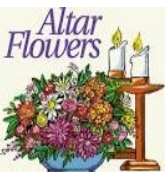

1962-1971

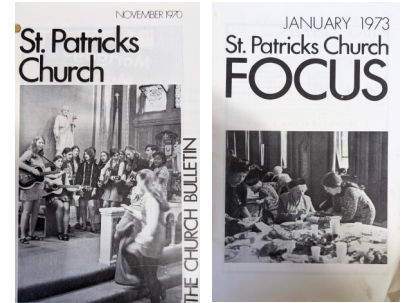


Msgr. Joseph Wiest was born in Greenville, New Jersey on September 15, 1895. He studied at St. John's Seminary in Brooklyn and was ordained to the priesthood on May 26, 1923. He was a professor for thirteen years at St. Joseph's College in Brooklyn. In 1943 he was assigned as Administrator of St. Ambrose parish in Brooklyn. He was assigned the pastorate to St. Augustine in 1951. In 1962 he was assigned the pastorate at St. Patrick.

Msgr. Joseph Wiest was Chairman for the Board of the diocese newspaper *The Tablet* and Dean of the Kings County West Deanery. He also enjoyed singing and recorded an album. The proceeds were donated to the Propagation of the Faith.

In 1966 a new and larger Convent was built for the Sisters across the street from the church on 95th Street and Fourth Avenue. The old convent was used as a center for Girl Scout meetings and music studio.

From 1955, *The Church Bulletin* was distributed to the parishioners. The publication included general articles about the Church purchased from the Printer and advertisements defrayed the cost of the booklet. In May 1970 the format changed and contained news written and edited by the parishioners of St. Patrick's parish. In June 1971 the monthly publication was renamed *Focus*.



Msgr. Wiest retired in 1971 and remained at St. Patrick's as Pastor Emeritus.

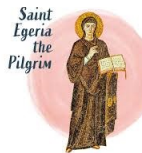

St. Egeria the Pilgrim The Eucharistic Prayer (Part 3)

The thirteen Eucharistic Prayers are different, but they have the following common elements:

- 1) *Epiclesis*: The Church implores the power of the Spirit that the gifts offered become Christ's Body and Blood, and that the unblemished sacrificial Victim consumed in Communion may be for the salvation of those who receive it.
- 2) *Institution narrative and consecration*: Through the words and actions of Christ, the sacrifice that Christ instituted during the Last Supper—when he offered his Body and Blood under the species of bread and wine, gave them to the apostles, and commanded them to perpetuate this same mystery—is made present again.
- 3) *Anamnesis*: The Church recalls Christ's passion, resurrection, and ascension into heaven.
- 4) *Oblation*: The Church offers the unblemished sacrificial Victim in the Spirit to the Father. The faithful not only offer this sacrificial Victim but also offer themselves, so that God may be all in all.
- 5) *Intercessions*: The Eucharist is celebrated in communion with the whole Church, and here the congregation prays for a variety of the needs and problems of her members, living and dead.
- 6) *Concluding doxology*: We glorify God and conclude with the people's acclamation, "Amen."
