## Everyday Stewardship

You could buy a meal for a person who is hungry or for a person who just ate a feast. You could spend time with a lonely person or with someone who has more friends than you. You could step forward to join a parish committee that your experience and knowledge can help, or you can join a ministry where you will constantly struggle to figure out what to do. All of the above actions involve you giving and sharing yourself and your gifts. But not all of these actions will bear good fruit.

If a sower sows seeds only on rocky or weed-infested soil, nothing of great value will grow. But if that same sower plants his seeds in rich soil, then the harvest will one day be great. In all of the soils, the seed is being sown, but it is not the act of sowing that is the most important factor.

In living a stewardship way of life, we must discern how best to share our gifts. Discernment needs the Holy Spirit and a desire to follow God's will, not our own. Our own desires and misconceptions can cause us to use our gifts unwisely. The more mindful we are of how, when, and why we are sharing ourselves, than the greater the impact for God's glory. God wants all of you, but not in a way that is without understanding and discernment. He wants you to shine as a light to the world through your stewardship just as He came to you as the Light of the World in baptism. You can't shine brightly if the match does not hit the wick.





Anyone in the Diocese of Brooklyn who has direct contact with children is required to follow the Safe Environment Mandates:

- Attend a VIRTUS workshop: Protecting God's Children for Adults.
- Sign a Code of Conduct,
- Authorize a criminal background screening

## **Further Requirements:**

- Continuing Education: All clergy and employees who have direct access to children are required to do continuing training, which is done online.
- Transfers: Anyone who transfers to a new parish or school must fill out a new background search and Code of Conduct form.
- High school aged volunteers have the option to attend either a VIRTUS workshop or complete an online teen safety course, Healthy Relationships.

## Saint Egeria the Pilgrim

## St. Egeria the Pilgrim Communion Rite (Part One)

The Lord's Prayer, the beloved prayer Jesus gave to his followers during his Sermon on the Mount, begins the Communion Rite. The congregation

prays for "daily bread," which may be received if properly disposed in Eucharistic Communion. The Lord's Prayer concludes "and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil," which are fruits that come from unity with the Living God.

The celebrant adds the embolism (a short bridge invocation), which develops the last petition of the prayer and asks for deliverance from evil for the whole community. The people assent to the embolism by means of the doxology acclamation: "For the kingdom. . ."

The Rite of Peace follows, where the congregation prays for peace and unity. This desired peace is not just for those present but for the whole human family. Finally, the faithful express to each other their ecclesial communion and mutual charity before communicating in the sacrament.

While the actual sign of peace to be given is established by the bishops' conference of each country or region; a kiss, handshake, bow, or small wave are all common. The *General Instruction for the Roman Missal* says, "It is appropriate that each person, in a sober manner, offer the sign of peace only to those who are nearest."
