On the flipside, have any of you have sworn you're not going to demean yourself by explaining, for the thousandth time, that you need extra help with the kids before soccer practice, or that you feel ignored when your spouse doesn't ask how your day went?

But sadly, love doesn't give you the ability to read minds. And in the end, we learn the lesson again and again, we have to verbalize our feelings, our needs, our wants. Expecting your partner to anticipate your needs is guaranteed to end badly.

It's the same with God, even though, oddly enough, He does have the ability to read minds. But He still desires us to explain ourselves to Him, doesn't He? "I'm feeling scared of this." "I'm really worried about that." "God, I think I need x, y and z. Help me. Please."

Jesus slept on that boat, as it was tossed and turned by the waves, until his disciples woke him. "Why were you sleeping?" they ask. Well, geniuses, he was sleeping because they hadn't woken him up yet. They had wasted time cowering in fear, waiting for him to act. They gave him the silent treatment and they didn't even know it.

That act of opening yourself up, of becoming vulnerable, of relying on Him, trusting Him. If it feels like God is asleep in your life, ask yourself this, have you tried waking Him up?


Our 175th Anniversary Year provides us time to reflect on our spiritual journey, acknowledge the contributions of our parish family and rejoice in the unity and growth we have experienced over the years.

## 1971-1977

Father Francis P. O'Loughlen was born in Jamaica, Queens, the youngest of six children. He was ordained June 6, 1936 and assigned to St. Bernadette parish on 13th Avenue, Brooklyn. He served as Army Captain from 1945 to 1949 in the European and Asian theaters. After military release he then served at St. Francis of Assisi parish, Astoria and St. Thomas Aquinas, Flatlands, Brooklyn. He returned to military service as Chaplain during the Korean conflict and returned to the Diocese in 1955.

In 1971 he was assigned the pastorate at St. Patrick. Fr. O'Laughlen revitalized parish activities. He expanded the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (C.C.D.) and introduced Adult Education classes. In 1972 a group of fifty men, women and teenagers joined together and formed *Friendly Visitors* which provided various services to the homebound. In 1974 a nine week Home Mission program was conducted in parishioners' homes that included Eucharistic celebrations. A marching band was also formed in 1974. In 1976 the first volunteers of men and women were in formation to become Extraordinary Ministers.

Father O'Loughlen retired in 1977 and continued to reside in the parish. He died on May 17, 1991, age 84.

## Communion Rite (Part Two)

In the Fraction Rite, the celebrant breaks the Eucharistic host as the people sing the Lamb of God. He places

a piece of the host into the chalice, signifying the unity of the Body and Blood of the Lord in the work of salvation.

Before receiving, all acknowledge their unworthiness to receive so great a gift. The celebrant receives first and then those properly prepared. Individuals unable to receive the Eucharist still participate by praying for union with Christ and with each other. As the celebrant receives, the Communion chant/song is begun, helping to foster visible union by the unity of voices. A meditation hymn may follow. There should also be time for silent prayer.

The faithful approach the minister and, bowing with reverence, receive Holy Communion. People may receive the Eucharist either on the tongue or in the hand. When permitted, the Precious Blood may also be received, with the communicant taking the chalice and consuming some before returning the chalice to the minister. The minister offers the Eucharist/chalice saying, "The Body (or Blood) of Christ." The communicant responds, "Amen."

The Communion Rite ends with the Prayer after Communion, asking that the fruits of the mystery just celebrated may be a fixture in our daily lives.


