The Prophecy of You and Me

Prophet. There's a heaviness to this word. It's weighted down with meaning. We think of prophets and we think of Charlton Heston with wild hair and a booming voice, reaching out his hand to work wonders of nature by the grace of God. We think of prophets and we think of ancient Biblical history — someone far away, someone so removed from our everyday life. A prophet is someone who knows something we don't.

When I let you in on this secret, it might scare you at first: in a way, God is calling you to be a prophet. He is calling me. He is calling anyone who hears the truth of the Gospel. However, there is no need for the megaphone and the wild locusts. This prophet gig might not be what you're thinking.

What does a prophet do? He hears and testifies to the truth, even when it's uncomfortable, even when it's unpopular, even when it results in, as Paul says, "weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions and constraints." A prophet doesn't have to be smart or rich or ordained; heck, he doesn't even have to be particularly willing.

All a prophet has to do is listen to the truth. The truth we receive from Christ, through the Gospel and the sacraments, is a mighty gift. But it is a gift that we are not meant to simply keep for ourselves. In possessing it, we are compelled to also pass it on, to share it, to let the Spirit set us on our feet.



St. Egeria the Pilgrim

The Church Building:
Domus Dei-Domus
Ecclesiae - Part One
(House of God-House of the
Church Community)

After exploring the Mass, let's begin looking at the church building itself.

Whether in the home, under the open sky, or later near the burial places of martyrs in the catacombs, early Christians celebrated the Eucharist wherever was most opportune. There were few, if any, places exclusively set aside for worship.

The empire's legalization of Christianity in AD 313 changed that, and Emperor Constantine himself offered one of his palaces to the pope for a dedicated worship site for the Christian community. Today we can still visit and worship at the Archbasilica of the Most Holy Savior and of Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist in the Lateran, more commonly known as the Lateran Basilica, which is the cathedral church of the Diocese of Rome and the mother church of Christendom. The word basilica is from the Greek meaning "royal house." For Catholics, it is used to show a special connection with the bishop of Rome, the pope.

A permanent site gave the Christians both home and house for the Church community (domus ecclesiae). With their new houses of worship, there was no longer need to gather in homes or out in the countryside. Many of the new church buildings were in fact located near the burial places of the martyrs.

Saint Patrick's 175th Anniversary! 1977-1988

In 1977 Father Joseph Parks was assigned the pastorate to St. Patrick. He was born and raised in Brooklyn and was ordained June 3, 1939. In 1981 Father Parks was granted the honorary title of Monsignor in recognition of his service to the diocese.

Some of the many activities and societies continued from previous pastorates: The Church Choir, Holy Name Society, Men's Club, Rosary Society, Cheerleaders, Baton Twirlers, Girls Soccer Team, Girls Basketball and Softball Teams, The Boys Baseball Team, Scout Troop 295 and the Teen Club.

After several months of preparation the first group of Eucharistic Ministers were installed at St. Patrick on March 24, 1977. During the same year Catholics were granted permission by the Holy See and received Holy Communion in the hand. In 1980 both species of Holy Communion were distributed at St. Patrick.

In 1979 the Shore Hill Apartments for Senior Citizens was opened and many St. Patrick parishioners were among the first residents to move into the complex. The priests from St. Patrick offered Mass several times yearly on Feast Days and Holidays.

In 1982 the organ in the choir loft was overhauled with new Mixtures, Great and Swell divisions. At that time Aldo Bruschi, Music Director and a graduate from Julliard School of Music was the church organist.

During his pastorate the Church roof and boiler were replaced. The walls were painted including the lower chapel. In 1987 Msgr. Parks made an appeal to the parishioners and brought St. Patrick's School out of deficit.











Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (O.C.I.A.) A unique process of initiation, formation and spiritual growth.

O.C.I.A. accommodates a mixed group: People who desire to learn about and join the Catholic Church; baptized Catholics who want to complete their Sacraments (First Communion and Confirmation) and fully initiated Catholics who want to learn more about their Faith. (must be 14 years or older)

O.C.I.A. sessions include the presentation of faith lesson and group discussion in an informal atmosphere that encourages questions and individual reflection. Weekly sessions include discussions about the Catholic faith, scripture and faith-sharing. The highlight of reception of the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil and culminates in the development of living one's life as a Catholic Christian.


