

The Gathering Space, or Vestibule

The gathering space, or vestibule, fulfills a dual purpose, practical and symbolic.

Practically, besides being an entrance and exit to the body of the church where the community is welcomed and greeted before and after celebrations, the space is used for many ceremonies and rites of the sacred liturgy. Many of the processions of the various celebrations throughout the church year begin here. Before Sunday Mass, it's where the various ministers gather. The gathering space is used by those preparing for Easter sacraments; where families are greeted for baptisms; and the faithful are greeted for the last time before the Mass of Christian Burial. Liturgical processions for other celebrations may also originate here, as on the Feast of the Presentation, Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, and the Easter Vigil. It may also lead to the sacristy, restrooms, or other useful spaces.

Symbolically, the gathering space is a place of transition from the profane (worldly) to the sacred (heavenly). We leave daily life to join with Christ as he offers himself to his Father, and we return strengthened by Word and Sacrament to share the fruits of that experience with others we encounter, cooperating with Jesus in his work in the present day.



Saint Patrick's 175th Anniversary! 1988-2004

Mgr. Patrick Fursey replaced Msgr. Parks as Pastor in 1988. Shortly after his arrival the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults Program and Scripture Faith Sharing Groups commenced at St. Patrick's, He interviewed all new parishioners and children's parents in the School and Confraternity of Christian Program.



In May 1993 the church building renovation and restoration had begun and construction was completed in May 1994. A new Baptismal font was located inside the center of the church. The newly constructed tabernacle was a replica of the outside church building and located inside the archway niche to the left of the altar. The sanctuary lamp was overhung in front of the archway niche and above the tabernacle. The beautiful stained glass windows were cleaned and repaired. There are 16 windows on the main floor depicting the life of Jesus from the



Annunciation to the Ascension. The Crucifixion is represented by the mosaic in the Sanctuary behind the altar. Two windows are in the choir loft; one is the Ángel window and the other, the magnificent rose window. Central air conditioning and sound systems were installed and a ramp was built outside the church for wheelchair accessible mobility.



A diocese-wide campaign Alive in Hope was announced in 1995. Hose monies were used for payment of parish debt to the diocese and renovating the two school buildings. The chapel in the old convent was renovated and converted to an Adoration Chapel with a ramp approach where the Blessed Sacrament was enthroned during the week. The basement of the building was transformed with meeting rooms and kitchen facilities. The first floor was set aside for the Religious



Education Office, Human Services Office, a Music Studio and a room for classes and meetings. The two upper floors were living quarters for Religious women from several Congregations. When the work was completed the building was named the Msgr. Parks Center.

Additional work on the physical plant continued in 1998 and 1999. The exterior of the school was cleaned and new windows were installed in all the buildings.

Msgr. O'Toole was transferred to St. Cecilia's in 2004.



Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (O.C.I.A.)

A unique process of initiation, formation and spiritual growth.

O.C.I.A. accommodates a mixed group: People who desire to learn about and join the Catholic Church; baptized Catholics who want to complete their Sacraments (First Communion and Confirmation) and fully initiated Catholics who want to learn more about their Faith. (must be 14 years or older)

O.C.I.A. sessions include the presentation of faith lesson and group discussion in an informal atmosphere that encourages questions and individual reflection. Weekly sessions include discussions about the Catholic faith, scripture and faith-sharing. The highlight of reception of the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil and culminates in the development of living one's life as a Catholic Christian.
