Stewardship Reflection

Jesus said to the crowd, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life..." We can hardly blame the crowd for their shock at this statement — eating the Flesh and drinking the Blood of our Lord should cause us a bit of a shock. Yet how easy it is to show up at Mass Sunday after Sunday, receiving the Eucharist as simply a part of a weekly routine.

If we really spent time contemplating the gift our Lord is offering us in this sacrament, we would be awestruck at the love and power in this gift. Through it, our Lord is giving us the very best He has to give — Himself. Not even the greatest theological scholar or the holiest of saints can fully understand this mystery.

Thankfully we don't need to be a saint or a scholar to receive this gift. But we should do our best to receive the Eucharist with gratitude. And we can look to today's readings to glean two fundamental principles for becoming better Christian stewards.

The Eucharist is the foundation for a stewardship way of life. Through His gift of the Eucharist, God fills us with His love and strength. This love and strength empower us to live as generous stewards — to be faithful to the ministries we serve in, joyful in material giving, and offer our very best to our families and secular work.

The Eucharist is the ultimate inspiration for a stewardship way of life. When we contemplate this gift of God, we will want to make a joyful return to Him. Mass will become anything but routine and we will live each day as His passionate disciples.



St. Egeria the Pilgrim

The Chair for the Priest Celebrant

After exploring the altar and ambo, it's time to look at the place from which the liturgy is led. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 310 states:

"The chair of the Priest Celebrant must signify his function of presiding over the gathering and of directing the prayer. Thus the more suitable place for the chair is facing the people at the head of the sanctuary, unless the design of the building or other features prevent this: as, for example, if on account of too great a distance, communication between the Priest and the congregation would be difficult, or if the tabernacle were to be positioned in the center behind the altar. In any case, any appearance of a throne is to be avoided. It is appropriate that before being put into liturgical use, the chair be blessed according to the rite described in the Roman Ritual."

The US bishops, in their document about building churches, add: "An appropriate placement of the chair allows the priest celebrant to be visible to all in the congregation. The chair reflects the dignity of the one who leads the community in the person of Christ, but is never intended to be remote or grandiose. The priest celebrant's chair is distinguished from the seating for other ministers by its design and placement" (63).



This space will be used, bi-weekly, to delve into our parish's history.


2004-2013

On February 5th, 2004, Bishop DiMarzio appointed Reverend Msgr. Joseph Nagle as Pastor of St. Patrick's Church, Bay Ridge, Brooklyn. On Sunday, March 21, 2004, at 12:30, Bishop Sullivan presided over the Liturgy of the Mass and installed Msgr. Joseph Nagle as Pastor of St. Patrick.

Msgr. Nagle re-introduced the Family Sunday Mass at 9:30 AM, oversaw the development of the Children's Ministry and implemented the Liturgy of the Word for Children. New apostolates were formed or revived at the parish; The Legion of Mary , the Divine Mercy Cenacles, the Fatima Apostolate and a Young Adults Ministry. A Chapter of Communion and Liberation was also meeting regularly at St. Patrick's. Alterations of the Sanctuary were planned by the newly formed Pastoral Planning Council and a new Tabernacle was placed directly behind the Altar in the center of the Sanctuary. Also, the Pastoral Council was to discern the mission and goals of the parish community.

In 2008 a strategic planning process had begun in the Diocese of Brooklyn called Preserving the Vision. That was an advisory committee composed of religious and lay people committed to Catholic education. Individuals on the committee were

leaders in the Catholic faith, specialized educators, lawyers, marketing professionals, financial advisors and developmental specialists. Catholic elementary schools created multiple partnerships and were transformed into academies that included competent lay leadership in its governance. Msgr. Joseph Nagle and Mrs. Andrea D'Emic, Principal of St. Patrick's School, the diocesan leaders through Preserving the Vision initiative, formed an advisory board with St. Anselm's parish which ensured Catholic education at St. Patrick's Parish.

Anyone in the Diocese of Brooklyn who has direct contact with children is required to follow the Safe Environment Mandates:

- Attend a VIRTUS workshop: Protecting God's Children for Adults
- Sign a Code of Conduct
- Authorize a criminal background screening

Further Requirements:

- Continuing Education: All clergy and employees who have direct access to children are required to do continuing training, which is done online.
- Transfers: Anyone who transfers to a new parish or school must fill out a new background search and Code of Conduct form.
- High school aged volunteers have the option to attend either a VIRTUS workshop or complete an online teen safety course, Healthy Relationships.
