

St. Egeria the Pilgrim

The Tabernacle

The practice of preserving after the celebration of the liturgy a portion of the consecrated bread for the Communion of the sick was observed as early as the second century AD. While the ways of keeping some of the Eucharist varied from place to place, the extreme antiquity of the practice cannot be disputed. "God is with us" in a unique and intimate way in the Blessed Sacrament.

The word tabernacle means "dwelling place." The tabernacle in a Catholic church is so named because it is a place where Christ dwells in the Holy Eucharist. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal explains:

"In accordance with the structure of each church and legitimate local customs, the Most Blessed Sacrament should be reserved in a tabernacle in a part of the church that is truly noble, prominent, conspicuous, worthily decorated, and suitable for prayer.

The tabernacle should usually be the only one, be irremovable, be made of solid and inviolable material that is not transparent, and be locked in such a way that the danger of profanation is prevented to the greatest extent possible. Moreover, it is appropriate that before it is put into liturgical use, the tabernacle be blessed according to the rite described in the Roman Ritual." (GIRM, 314)

Saint Patrick's 175th anniversary!



St. Patrick's is proud to be a pillar of the Catholic faith in Bay Ridge for 175 years and we want to celebrate this amazing achievement with our parishioners and community.

Our 175th Anniversary Year provides us time to reflect on our spiritual journey, acknowledge the contributions of our parish family and rejoice in the unity and growth we have experienced over the years.

This space will be used, bi-weekly, to delve into our parish's history.

2004-2013

Monsignor Nagle was appointed to succeed Monsignor Fursey O'Toole early in 2004. Msgr. Nagle picked up the reins of a bustling parish. During his time as pastor, St. Patrick's continued as a leading parish in support of the Diocesan Catholic Appeal. Activities such as the Spring Festival and the Taste of the Ridge filled the parish calendar.

Msgr. Nagle introduced the Family Mass to the Parish. Under his direction, children from various classes began attending daily Mass at the start of the school day. There was a robust group of altar servers, with many children continuing into their high school years. St. Patrick's became a leader in the number of teens and young adults attending World Youth Day Celebrations.

2005 was an active year, but filled with sad events. Msgr. Joseph Parks, St. Patrick's long time Pastor and Pastor Emeritus, died in March. Pope John Paul II died in April and Msgr. Martin Bannon, a well known and beloved Priest of the diocese who served at St.

Patrick's, died in December.

In 2006, the Diocese began the Pastoral Planning Process. As part of the process, a Parish Assembly was held in February, 2007, and a Parish Pastoral Council was established. After reviewing feedback from the Parish Assembly and a period known as the listening process, the Pastoral Council issued the Parish Mission Statement which still appears in the Church Bulletin every Sunday. A series of goals were set, and Parishioners were asked to sign up to work on those goals to encourage the growth of the Lay Ministry. Several new parish groups were formed, and a series of Ministry Fairs was begun. Among the initiatives was the placement of a new tabernacle back on the main altar.

In 2008 a chapter of Communion and Liberation came to the Parish.

At the direction of the Diocese, Parish Pastoral Councils then began a period of examination of the future of their parishes given financial difficulties and changes in the demographics in an effort to determine how best to use our resources to meet the future. St. Patrick's was considered among the strongest parishes in the diocese.

In 2011 the Blessed Sacrament Chapel was restored as a result of the generosity of a parishioner (Joe Sokolowski).

St Patrick's Parish has always been known for its generosity. In 2005, the parish contributed over \$22,000 to victims of hurricane Katrina in New Orleans. In 2012 there was a stronger test closer to home. Hurricane Sandy dealt a devastating blow to New York City, particularly the Rockaways. Catholic schools there were badly damaged and temporarily closed. St. Patrick's reached out, and welcomed over 100 students to our school. The parish held collections and benefits for their families. Many of the students stayed even after their schools were repaired and reopened. The expressions of gratitude from the families were heartfelt, and the close relationship of our common parishioners was further cemented.

St. Patrick's School has always been at the core of the Parish. As such, it has always been well supported

by the parish community. In 2012 the Computer Room and the Library were refurbished.

As a result of financial pressures and declining enrollment the Diocese introduced a new paradigm for parish schools. Parish schools would become independent of the parish and become Academies. After a period of transition, the Academies would be self supporting. The initial plan for Bay Ridge was to combine the schools of the three "Fourth Avenue Parishes" into one Academy. Msgr. Nagle led a delegation from St. Patrick's including Principal Andrea D'Emic, that, with Our Lady of Angels and St. Anselm's, advocated keeping the three schools/Academies open. St. Patrick's Academy has emerged from the process as a strong, independent and growing school.

In 2013 Msgr. Nagle left St. Patrick's because of health issues.


