Stewardship Reflection

In our Gospel today we hear the story of a man who ran up to Jesus and asked Him what he must do to reach eternal life.

Jesus said, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me."

It says the man went away sad because he had much.

We might cringe when we hear this story because it is sad—this man was so close to becoming an active disciple of Jesus, but instead turned away. We also might cringe because it could be deeply applicable to our lives.

Jesus states that, "It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God."

One of the metaphors for the "eye of a needle" was a tight passageway into Jerusalem that people had to enter to get into the city. In order for their camels to pass through, they had to remove whatever the camel was carrying, only then, could they enter.

If we look at our own lives, we can most likely think of something that we tightly carry with us. Maybe it is possessions — material goods or money — like Jesus references in our Gospel. Or maybe it is something less material — like status, pride or control.

Jesus doesn't want our stuff — our job promotions, our designer house or our bank account. He just wants us. So, we need to be willing to strip those things from our lives in order to reach Him. It might seem difficult, but the outcome will be more than we could have ever imagined — peace on earth and treasure in heaven.

Holy Water Fonts

Holy water fonts are nonporous vessels that contain holy water usually located near church entrances. They were first used in the 400s. Upon entering church, the faithful dip their right hands in the water and make the Sign of the Cross. These receptacles vary in size, architectural materials, and artistic expression. Some may be small and simple while others large and grandiose. Placing these receptacles by the church entrances delineate the passage from the worldly to the sacred.

This entrance ritual is a reminder of baptism. In baptism the Christian shares in the priestly office of Christ Jesus that will be exercised in the celebration of Holy Mass. Water is a sign of life and cleansing. The use of holy water, to sign oneself, is also a reminder of those baptismal promises made, or made on our behalf, that not only reject evil throughout our daily lives but also affirm our belief in the Triune God (Blessed Trinity) as evoked in the Sign of the Cross.

Holy water which is blessed by a bishop, priest or deacon is a "sacramental." The catechism teaches: "[Sacramentals] are sacred signs which bear a resemblance to the sacraments" in this case, baptism, and they orient us to the effects of the sacraments. (CCC1667)



Saint Patrick's 175th anniversary!



St. Patrick's is proud to be a pillar of the Catholic faith in Bay Ridge for 175 years and we want to celebrate this amazing achievement with our parishioners and community. Our 175th Anniversary Year provides us time to reflect on our spiritual journey, acknowledge the contributions of our parish family and rejoice in the unity and growth we have experienced over the years.

2019-2022

In July, 2019, Father Gerard J. Sauer was named Pastor of St.Patrick's, and the newly ordained Fr. Michael F. Falce was appointed Parochial Vicar.

The period of 2019-2022 saw great changes and challenges.

Changes.The last of the Sisters of St. Joseph, Teresa, Febronia, and Eileen, left St. Patrick's, and Sister Jean Elaine retired after 37 years. In January, 2020, Fr. Richard Bretone was reassigned to St. Francis Xavier Parish in Park Slope. After 18 years, Bishop Nicholas DiMarzio retired in 2021, and Bishop Robert Brennan was appointed in November, 2021.

Challenges. The world was shaken in February, 2020 by the rapid spread of Covid 19, which would go on to kill millions of people worldwide. Recognizing the threat that this very contagious virus posed, many restrictions were placed on the way we lived, worked and interacted with people. As of March 19, 2020 all Churches and schools were closed. Masses were not celebrated in Churches. The diocese began streaming Masses from the co-cathedrals, St. James and St. Joseph's. No weddings or funerals were performed, and all activities were suspended. The St. Vincent DePaul Food Pantry was closed, and reopened after 8 weeks with severe restrictions. In April, St. Patrick's began to stream Masses from the Church. The Church Bulletin continued to be published and Fr. Peter Poonoly contributed several long essays regarding the Faith.

At the end of May, 2020, the church began a phased reopening. At the end of June, Masses resumed with many restrictions. Attendance was restricted to 25% the capacity of the Church. Separation had to be maintained. In September, 2020 the Parish was saddened by the death of Msgr. Joseph Nagle who had served as Pastor from 2004 to 2013.

As the world gradually reopened, St. Patrick's began to reassess what was needed to be done to maintain the Church and the other parish buildings for the future. The William O'Connell School building needed a new roof and pointing. The Church exterior had to be repointed before any interior work could be done. The heating system for all the buildings needed to be redone.

To address the needs, a campaign to raise \$1.3 million, - Deeply Rooted - Firmly Planted was begun in March, 2021. Parishioners were asked to make long term commitments to the Parish in order to ensure that St. Patrick's would be able to continue its mission and remain a vital part of the community for years to come

Because of the need to do this work, and the faith that parishioners would respond to the campaign, the work was begun at the same time that the Deeply Rooted—Firmly Planted campaign began.


The choir practices every Sunday at 11:15 a.m. in the Msgr. Parks Center, 418-95th Street, and sings at the Noon Mass from September to June.
